
### FINDING THE RESULTS

1) Go to <a href="http://www.hamilton.bridge-club.org/">http://www.hamilton.bridge-club.org/</a> so you see this page:



2) You will see on the left a menu called **Results**. The first three items are what you will use to see how you did on a club night.

  - 3) The first option, Hamilton Results, will give you a list of current events in progress



If you know the name of the event you want to look at then simply click on the Session you wish to view and you can also look at the Ladder to see how you are getting on overall.

4) The second option, **Monthly Results**, opens up a calendar:

From here you can go to the date of the session and click on it. You can also click on the ladder. If you just want to look at your result from today or yesterday this is an easy way to find it.

- 5) You can also click on **X-Clubs Results**. This opens up the Compassmate website and from there you can click on **section Hamilton** to see your score now that the boards have been scored against all the other clubs. Clicking on **overall** gives you a complete list of all the pairs who played those boards and where you sit. To make it quick to find yourself hit **ctrl F** on your computer and type your last name into the "Find" box that appears and it will automatically take you to that line (which is hopefully closer to the top than the bottom!)
- 6) Clicking on **Ladder** gives you a progress report on the competition. Note that the Handicap result is displayed first, and you will need to scroll down to see the raw result.

## **ANALYSING THE RESULTS**

1) Let's say you have clicked on the session you want to view. Once you have the result screen it will look a bit like this:


If you click on the pair name, you will get the page with the details of how the pair scored on each board played

#### Overall results per board:



The Gross Results are on top, the Handicap results will below as you scroll down.

2) If you want to look at the hand records for each board (just like the hard copies that get handed out at the end of play) you simply click on **Hand Record** and it will appear. However you may be more interested in seeing the "travellers" for each board. You can click on a 6 board block or on All to display these.



These tell you the contract, the result, and the lead as inputted on the BridgeMates. It also shows the score and the Match Points earned.

3) A neat feature of this program is that you can have a look at how you (and others) did on each board. Click on a pair name on the results screen and you get an analysis of how you did on each board:



As you can see it is colour coded and there are some symbols alerting you to the boards you performed really well or really poorly on. Now let's say I want to know why I got zero matchpoints for board 3, I can click on the 3 and up comes:

As you can see you get a full list of the results as well as the hand record with possible contracts for this board. In this case I can see the double was theoretically correct but the defensive play let it down, turning what should have been a 100% board into a 0% board (bugger...)
