Measuring our Air

Have you heard an unusual 'beep, beep, beep' while playing bridge recently?



That's the sound of a CO2 meter warning! Richard Wagstaff has been taking readings in the clubrooms under different conditions of playing numbers, windows open or shut, ceiling fans on or not and various combinations of these. This is all to find out if we have a problem with air quality (short answer - yes, at times) and for the committee to consider what to do about this. This article explains more about CO2 monitoring and what it means.

A background level is around 400 ppm with a general target to minimise infection transfer below 1000ppm.

Here's Richard's summary of some measurements taken at the bridge club:

(You may wonder why we are measuring CO2 when we are worried about Covid - the brief answer is that if the room air is stagnant Covid will "hang around" waiting for a host to infect. If the air is kept clean by being refreshed regularly, Covid finds it more difficult to attach itself either because it is in moving air or it is no longer present because it is moved outside when the room air is replaced with clean fresh air.

The other part of this discussion is air filtering - air filters such as those used in Air NZ's newer long-range jets can reduce the Covid level in the air. These are now becoming available at a retail level suitable for the Club to consider installing a small number of Air Cleaner units to improve the playing room air quality.

While neither of these - fresh air and filtering guarantee Covid will not be present, together they should lower the possibility of a Covid infection taking place at the Club)

I'm leaving ... what now?



When you no longer wish to be a member of the Club, we ask you to please tell the Club of your pending departure.

This advance notice lets us plan your removal from the Clubs Systems - both Compass and Compa\$\$ - and allows us to return to you any surplus funds we hold on your behalf. Also, it will let us advise NZ Bridge of your departure thus saving us some or all of \$23 levy we pay annually for each member.

NZ Bridge National Congress Coming Soon

The 2022 Bridge National Congress will be held at a new venue, the Trustpower Arena, Mt Maunganui, from Saturday 1 October to Saturday 8 October.

The last face-to-face Congress in 2019 had over 700 players. In February this year, 620 players attended the delayed 2021 Online Congress.

Youth players will get a 50% discount on any Congress event.

Visit the Congress <u>website</u>, read the Information tab, then enter or view events. There are no evening sessions and 9:30am starts most mornings.

There are separate special events for novice, junior and intermediate players too:

Novice Pairs – a single session on the afternoon of Sunday 2 October (A novice has less than three years' experience and was without a Certificate of Proficiency at 1 January 2022). Only \$10 for this session.

New Zealand Junior Pairs - 2 sessions on Thursday 6 October Junior Teams - 2 sessions on Friday 7 and 2 sessions on Saturday 8 October.

Intermediate Swiss Pairs - 2 sessions on Wednesday 5 October

New Zealand Intermediate Pairs - 2 sessions on Thursday 6 October

Intermediate Teams - 2 sessions on Friday 7 and 2 sessions on Saturday 8 October.

The lower ranking Open players are able to play with Intermediates and Juniors in the following events:

New Zealand Restricted Open Pairs: from Sat 1 October for 5 sessions (Sat and Sun morning and afternoon and Monday morning)

New Zealand Restricted Open Teams: 4 sessions from Mon 3 October (Mon afternoon, Tues morning and afternoon and Wed morning)

For all events, you must **enter in advance** - close-off is the day before the event but you are encouraged to enter earlier to help with their planning.





Tip of the Day:

In No Trumps, when you are one trick short of your contract and have a finesse available that likely won't succeed, think how to throw the danger hand on lead for the last trick
