From the President

FIFA

Winter Lessons Start

A second set of lessons for this year started on Sunday 23rd July at the Hamilton Bridge Clubrooms. The first 2 weeks were spent playing Minibridge, a simplified version of the game before the lessons proper commence on Sunday 6th August at 1pm with each lesson taking about 2.5 hours. More learners are still welcome to join at this stage of the course.

These lessons teach the game using the ACOL bidding system and are based on NZ Bridge's teaching of bridge for beginners program.

The lesson continue a further 10 weeks and when they finish you are encouraged to join the Club. Those who choose to join the Club usually start playing together with other learners either on Tuesday evening or Friday morning in what is a very friendly and social atmosphere where an allowance is made for their 'beginner' status. Each participant receives a copy of the lessons and other training notes, along with supper after each lesson.

Tuesday evening lessons finished recently and the learners are now playing at our regular sessions. We all know what a complex and confusing game bridge can be at first, so please make them welcome. Why not offer to be a partner if needed? Be prepared to be patient with slow play and limit your comments until they find their feet. We want everyone to enjoy our great game!

Thursday Night Change of Start Time

UNTIL AFTER daylight saving commences on 25th September, the start time for Thursday Bridge is 7pm.

Unless this change is subjected to a later update Thursday Bridge will return to a 7.30pm start time on 29th September.

Be Kind to Your Directors

Before Play Starts:

Make sure you are seated at a table (not making a drink in the kitchen!) 5 minutes before play is due to start. This allows the director to correctly count the number of occupied tables and set up the movement for the session. If the movement setup is wrong, the whole scoring system and Bridgemates have to be re-started, meaning a start delay (and later finish).



During Play:

If you are phantom, waiting between rounds or if you finish the last round early, it would be greatly appreciated by the directors if you collect any empty cups from the playing room and return them to the tray in the kitchen. If the tray is full, put the tray in the steriliser and after closing the door push the far-right button to start the sterilising process.

After Play ends:

Just like us, our directors like to get home at a reasonable hour. After play finishes at your table, tidy the pens and pad away, return the table numbers and boards to the director's table, the Bridgemate to the cupboard, and take the scrap paper to the recycling bin near the door.

NZ Bridge National Congress Coming Soon

The 2023 Bridge National Congress will once again be face-to-face and held at the Mercury BAYPARK (former Trustpower Arena), Mt Maunganui, from Saturday 23 September to Saturday 30 September.

The last face-to-face Congress in 2022 at Mt Maunganui had over 600 players and the organisers expect even more players to attend this year. Youth players (born after 31 December 1997) will get a 50% discount on any Congress event.

Visit the Congress <u>website</u>, read the Information tab, then enter or view events. There are 9:30am starts most mornings with no evening sessions.

There are separate special events for novice, junior and intermediate players too:

Novice Pairs – a single session from 2.30pm on the afternoon of Saturday 23 September. (A novice started playing after 1 January 2021 or was without a Certificate of Proficiency at 1 January 2021). Only \$10 for this session.

National Congress Junior Pairs - 2 sessions on Sunday 24 September. NZ Junior Teams - 4 rounds of 14 boards on Tuesday 26 and another 4 rounds on Wednesday 27 September.

National Congress Intermediate Pairs - 2 sessions on Sunday 24 Sept. NZ Intermediate Teams - 4 rounds of 14 boards on Tuesday 26 and another 4 rounds on Wednesday 27 September.

Intermediate Swiss Pairs - 3 rounds of 9 boards start 1.30pm Friday 29 September with 4 rounds on Saturday 30 September

Junior and Intermediate Pairs are \$60 or \$80 per player with a 10% discount if paid by 31 August, while the Teams are \$120 or \$140 per player. For all events, except the Novice Pairs, you must **enter in advance** - close-off is the day before the event but you are encouraged to enter earlier to help with their planning.


