With around 100 positions to park a car we can make up to \$2000 a day with very little effort. Our only requirement is for volunteers to assist park the cars and to take payments. We spread these tasks over short periods, so no one is inconvenienced for any lengthy period.

This was the case over the Sevens weekend when we were able to schedule our volunteers for a maximum of 2 hours each. Over the Sevens weekend our volunteers (Joan Egger, Bill Bailey, Ann-Maree Byrne, Ken Duffield, Tim Seavill, Peter Craig, Geoff Walpole, Roger Johnston, Phil Thomson, Sam Armstrong, Angus MacDonald and Jane Sandelin) assisted with parking our guests and enjoyed the camaraderie of our guests. Along the way we welcomed ex-Mayors and occasional VIPs, fancy dress, and some witty conversations. It's a festive occasion! Many parkers asked after previous volunteers "How's Margaret?", "Where's Nigel?".

This year we hired the entire car park out to the NZ rugby union for the weekend. We also managed to park some other cars looking for space. Thanks also to Plunket who helped out with some parking due to a double booking.

Each year our revenues are enhanced by several thousand dollars due to this ongoing effort. This year the Seven's tournament netted our club \$5270. So that's a huge thank you to all involved, both past and present.

Happy New Year to all. I must say that the times I have played this year have been very pleasant experiences. People have been lovely and friendly and what a difference this makes to one's overall experience. I know I have been guilty of being grumpy at the table from time to time and I am making a pledge to try and not be.

So, let's keep up the joy. When opponents arrive at your table say hello, apologise if they have been held up whether it was your fault or not.



When asked for explanations of your bid give the best explanation you can give, i.e. rather than "weak", explain the bid as 6 card suit with 6-9 points. If you want to know what a particular bid means from the opposition ask for an explanation of the whole auction, not just the bid you want to know about, that way you won't give unauthorised information to your partner. If you don't want to bid, wait till the auction is over before making your enquiries. You can ask before you lead or if your partner is on lead ask your partner to lead face down, once the lead is on the table but before it is faced you can ask.

A few more tips to make playing an enjoyable experience for all:

- · Give credit when your opponents make a good bid or play.
- Ensure that your mobile phone is switched off.
- Enjoy the company as well as the game.
- Avoid the use of language that others may find offensive or even socially unacceptable.
- · Take care to summon and address the Director in a courteous manner
- and remember, the Director is your friend, there to help you.

Calling all Juniors! Intermediates! And Novices!

On Saturday 7 March, Hamilton is holding a tournament day especially for Novice, Junior and Intermediate players. This is a great chance for anyone who has never entered a tournament before to play in a friendly atmosphere. Talk to your regular partner about playing, or if they are not available ask at the club for anyone else who wants to play. It is always a good idea to practise with your partner before a tournament so you can discuss and understand your partnership bidding, discards and general playing style.

If you have less than 5 total A+B points you can enter the Novice tournament which is only one afternoon session - the Junior and Intermediate pairs play two sessions. You can check how many A+B points you have at the NZ Bridge masterpoints page <u>Search Masterpoints</u> - just enter your name or number.

Restricted Pairs

Sunday 19 April is the date of our restricted pairs tournament where Open players cannot play together, and Intermediate and Junior members are encouraged to partner with an Open player. There are also prizes for other combinations such as Intermediate/Intermediate, Junior/Junior, Intermediate/Junior and Novices if enough of these pairs are entered. On the three Wednesday nights starting 25 March before the restricted tournament there is a Restricted Pairs event for you to practice.

Help required

If you are not playing in a tournament and you can spare a couple of hours to help with running the tournament (this could be helping in the kitchen, collecting cups and washing them or looking after the morning or afternoon tea) please let Ella or Jane know.

How to Enter a Tournament on NZ Bridge

All our tournament entries are now being done through NZ Bridge. To enter a tournament you need to first register with NZ Bridge (you must have a valid email address to register). This only has to be done once, but you do need to remember your password to login in future.

To enter a tournament at our club find the tournament in the list on our <u>Club website</u> and click on the link for entries. This will take you to the tournament entry on NZ Bridge.

For a tournament at another club, login to NZ Bridge, choose the tournament you wish to enter, and click on ENTER HERE.

ENTER

In the Tournament entry window, your contact details will display along with your computer number. Your Name will appear as Player 1 by default. Enter your partner in the Player 2 field (it is best to search using a computer number). Important! - Wait until the player name appears in the drop-down list. You must then click on their name in the drop-down list, which will place their details in the Player 2 field. NB: Even if there is only one name appearing in the drop-down list, you still must click on the name.

For Teams, repeat the process for the rest of the team members. Hints:

- If you are entering for someone else, click on REMOVE to take your name out of the entry screen.
- If you wish to read more about the event, click on the name of the event in NZ Bridge. This will display any useful information the host club has recorded (start time, event cost, venue, lunch etc)
- Only the person who made the entry can edit it


