## 2024 Changes to Bridge Programme

By now, many of you will have had a chance to look at the new programme book. (If not, collect one from the club either when you come in to play a session, or from Julie during office hours). There are a few changes to the programme this year. Read on for more details!

#### Monday evening

- Monday now has an individual pairs in April. To be counted in this competition you need to play with 3 different players. This is to encourage you to try new partnerships. (You can still play with the same partner but will not be part of the competition even if you win).
- Three pairs, in Autumn, Winter and Spring) have been changed to Butler pairs scoring (see below for more information on Butler pairs).

## Wednesday evening

- Club Swiss pairs have been replaced by 3 Butler pairs, in Summer, Winter and Spring. The Open 5A Swiss Pairs tournament still remains.
- Teams events have been replaced by pairs events on 2 occasions while the Club Team Championship and Winter Drawn Teams remain.

#### Thursday evening

- Two pairs, in Autumn and Spring, are now Butler pairs (see below for more information on Butler pairs). There are no Swiss pairs anymore.
- The Restricted Teams event has been replaced but the Elsie Pohio Teams remain (this event decides the teams for the Waikato Interclub teams so we would like plenty of entries especially from Juniors!)

## Friday O'Neill room

- One Winter pairs event has been changed to Butler scoring (see below for what this means for you)

## Other Sessions

The programme for Tuesday afternoon, Tuesday evening and Friday Richmond room have not changed.

## What are Butler Pairs?

Butler pairs uses IMP scoring similar to Swiss pairs. The advantage over Swiss pairs is you don't need the same number of pairs each session. Like Swiss pairs you should always bid game if you think it is possible, and don't risk trying for overtricks if you might not make your contract as these are worth far less than in Matchpoint scoring (the normal pairs scoring).

#### From the Director's Table

Visitors to our club. It is important any visitors are introduced to the director before the session starts so table money can be collected from them and their name can be added to the scoring system if needed.

Seating. Please make sure you are seated at the table ready to play at least 5 minutes before the start time for your session. This means you have already got your drink from the kitchen! This allows the director to set up the movement for the session correctly - if this is wrong it usually means the whole scoring system needs to be restarted to correct it.

Seating rights. If you cannot easily move let the director know when you arrive, as the movement can require you to be seated at particular tables.

## Pianola and X-Clubs

Interested in how your bridge results compare with players from across NZ? You can do this!

The results from all NZ bridge clubs that play the same boards at the same time are collected up in X-Clubs, re-scored and cross-added over all the clubs which use Compass - often within a few minutes of the last result to come in. The cross-adds appear on the X-Clubs website very shortly after all sessions are in.

You can access these through the <u>X-Clubs Results</u> link on the club website. If you'd like to learn more about X-Clubs there is lots of detail under the About tab.

Players of X-Club deals can also register to receive Pianola session report e-mails - for FREE! - see the button on the right-hand side of the X-Clubs Home page.

This is the ultimate in results reporting. Your playing history builds up online and you can look back at every game you have played, even filtering by partner if you like.

Here you can get more information about your playing game, including:

Personal results history

Your average score with different partners

Your score as declarer, defender - even as dummy

If you wish, you can also join Pianola-Plus, the only part of the service for which you must pay. This gives you even more information on your playing.

## Calling all Juniors! Intermediates! & Novices!

On Saturday 16 March, Hamilton is holding a tournament day for Novice, Junior and Intermediate players. This is a great chance for anyone who has never entered a tournament before to play in a friendly atmosphere. Talk to your regular partner about playing, or if they are not available ask at the club for anyone else who wants to play. Practising with your partner before a tournament is a good idea so you can discuss and understand your partnership bidding, discards and general playing style etc.

If you have less than 5 A+B points you can enter the Novice tournament which is only one session after lunch – the Junior and Intermediate pairs play two sessions starting at 10am. You can check how many A+B points you have at the NZ Bridge masterpoints page <u>Search Masterpoints</u> – just enter your name or bridge number.

## Restricted Pairs

Sunday 7 April is the day the Club holds its annual restricted pairs tournament. In this tournament Open players cannot play together, so Intermediate and Junior members are encouraged to partner with an Open player. There are also prizes for other combinations such as Intermediate/Intermediate, Junior/Junior, Intermediate/Junior and Novices if enough of these pair combinations are entered (however this doesn't prevent any of these combinations playing together). On three Wednesday nights before the restricted tournament, starting 13 March, there is a Restricted Pairs event scheduled for you to practice.

## Hamilton Craigs Investments Day

Tuesday 7 May is reserved for the Craigs Investments Day - an Open and Intermediate 2 session tournament for all (this replaces the Ladies Day and is now open to Men as well).

## WAIKATO-BAYS COMPETITIONS 2024

These aim to develop partnerships and a better grasp of the game. Both the Junior and Intermediate leagues are individual competitions so you don't need to play with the same partner each time. The leagues are generally quite social and good fun with the added bonus of meeting other players from throughout our region.

## Waikato/Bay of Plenty Junior League

This is for 6 rounds with the overall top place-getters winning cash prizes. The first tournament is at Hamilton bridge club on Saturday 16 March. If your goal for 2024 is to become an Intermediate, playing in the Junior tournaments will give you a chance to get well on the way.

## Waikato/Bay of Plenty Intermediate League

Starting on Sunday 3 March at Taupo bridge club, followed by Hamilton on Saturday 16 March, this competition covers eight intermediate tournaments held in Waikato and Bay of Plenty, with the last one in October at Cambridge.

## Waikato Area Pairs (WAPs)

This competition in 2024 is aimed at open and intermediate players. The competition runs for 5 rounds with prizes awarded to the winning pair at each heat and to the top overall and top non-Open pair at the end of the competition.

The first heat for 2024 is on Sunday 10 March at Te Aroha. Pre-entry is requested for this heat but not required for other heats where you can just arrive between 9:30 and 9:45 with a partner. The entry fee for all heats is \$10 and you need to bring your own lunch. The other WAP dates are listed under tournaments in your 2024 programme book.

Intermediate players are encouraged to attend the WAPs, along with our regular open players, to experience the friendly WAP sessions and have a chance to win A points. More information can be found at their webpage WAP dates 2024

The Interprovincial Teams competition has been renamed by NZ Bridge to the Regional Championship Teams. Each regional team is made up of an Intermediate team and various Open teams. The trials will take place online on May 4 and 5 so start thinking now about whether you wish to enter. The finals will be held in Wellington from 29 November to 1 December.

## NZ Bridge Online Strategy - 2024 Weekends

The NZ Bridge Online Strategy Working Group have announced that once again on one specified weekend each month clubs with tournaments on these weekends can elect to run their event face-to-face or online.

Alternatively, they can apply to swap with other clubs.

NZ Bridge's seven major regional events (North Island Teams, North Island Pairs, South Island Teams, South Island Pairs, National Teams, National Pairs and National Swiss Pairs) may also be held in-person or online.

All other club weekend tournaments, mini congresses etc. will be run face-to-face as currently scheduled. However, applications to transition to online will be considered in emergency situations (e.g. weather or health-related).

It is expected that almost all Junior and Intermediate tournaments will be face-to-face.

NZ Bridge will be running online Matariki tournaments on Friday 28 June and these will be separate tournaments for each grade.

The trial online weekends for 2024 have not yet been announced. These may be available in February after this newsletter is published. To find out whether a tournament is online or face-to-face (in-person) go to the NZ Bridge tournaments page: Bridge Tournaments

## LEAD OUT OF TURN - WHAT SHOULD I DO?

I am about to play as declarer and the wrong opponent has led a card. What should I do? First, and most important, call the director to your table. This is one of the most common reasons for a director to be called and for this reason it is a good idea to understand your rights under the Laws of Bridge.

When the Lead Out of Turn (LOOT) is the opening lead, then the person who should be declarer has some options:

- 1 Accept the lead and put their own hand down as dummy so their partner plays it;
- 2 Accept the lead and put partner's hand down as dummy. If they choose to do this then dummy goes down straight away and plays fourth, rather than second;
- 3 Not accept the lead in which case it reverts to the correct person. If declarer decides to do this, they have two further options:
- a) Demand or forbid the player on lead to lead the suit that was led incorrectly. If this option is chosen, then the card incorrectly led is picked up;
- b) Tell the person on lead to make a normal lead in which case the card incorrectly led is a major penalty card to be played at the first legal opportunity. If this is chosen, then the person who leads must make a lead based on the bidding and their normal methods. They cannot be influenced by their partner's card.

#### What choice should I make?

You would only choose to accept the lead if you could see it had some advantage for you. For example, you might have a 7 count and your partner has 19 so it might be wise to lay your hand down. Perhaps they led a king to your singleton ace and this is helpful to you. Or you may have a more experienced player as your partner and decide they should play the hand! Similarly, you would demand or forbid a lead of the LOOT suit only if it had some advantage to you.

Count dummy's points, your own and estimate declarer's points to calculate how many points partner probably has. Do not try a defence that requires partner to have more high card points than is possible.
