REPORT FROM MARRAKECH

Early in 2023 we played in the NZ Trials in an attempt to qualify for the NZ Mixed Team to go to Morocco for the World Championships.

We weren't close to being successful so decided on a couple of bridge trips to Australia instead. First the Gold Coast Congress in Broadbeach, then the Barrier Reef Congress in Cairns.

Upon returning home from Cairns after having spent all our money :), the NZ Chef De Mission phoned to ask if we were available to replace a pair that were no longer able to attend. A once in a lifetime chance to play bridge in a world championship and just the weekend to think about it. Of course we said yes.

We arrived in Marrakech, Morocco a few days before the event started in late August and had time to check out the magnificent "Palais De Congress" where the event was being held, straight across the road from our apartment.

We started the event poorly with 2 losses but then went on a 5-match winning streak, getting into the top 8 (8 teams qualify for the next stage) on day three.

Unfortunately, we couldn't sustain that and although the team won a total of 10 matches, we finished in the bottom half of the field of 24 countries.

The overall experience was incredible, with the opportunity to play against a number of world champions.

The event was very well run from the opening ceremony to the playing conditions and closing ceremony.

After the bridge we took a 6 day tour through the Atlas Mountains including a camel ride through the desert, on to Fez, finishing in Casablanca from where we flew out. Little did we know that as we were in the air, Morocco was struck by a devastating earthquake. A narrow escape! We really felt for the wonderful friendly Moroccans we had met during our time there.

SUMMER BRIDGE STARTS TUESDAY 21 NOVEMBER

The regular programme of bridge for the year ends with the AGM. After this, Hamilton club runs Summer Bridge on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays over the summer break, except from 11 December 2023 to 14 January 2024 when there is NO BRIDGE (note the 2024 later start). Summer Bridge is open to ALL grades and ALL players (including members of ALL bridge clubs). For all sessions you will need to have organised your own partner before you arrive. Visitors will need to bring \$5 table money and give it to the director or pay by EFTPOS. Summer Bridge is stand-alone scratch, with NS and EW winners each night earning a free session of bridge at Hamilton.
